The Principles

Concerning the Priests

- No priest should be asked to do what he is not able to do.
- Priests should not be asked to do things that are manifestly unreasonable.
- The rights and needs of priests must be respected at all times.
- These rights include the right to adequate living quarters.
- Priests should only live in shared accommodation by mutual consent.
- Priests have a right to be cared for.
- Competent professional help should be available to priests when needed.
- Priests have a right to belong to a stable worshipping community.
- Every priest ministers in a unique and personal way.
- Priests minister according to Church law and under the guidance of the Bishop.
- The priest has a duty to provide care for the people.
- The priest must show flexibility and willingness to adapt.
- Plans for the future should not depend on the help of retired priests.
- There should be no pressure on priests to work beyond the age of 75.
- ♦ The priest must be willing to work with the Bishop and with fellow priests.
- Priests are called to a life of service.
- Priests have an obligation to be aware of Church teaching.
- Jesus is the model for priests at all times.

Concerning the People

- ♦ No parishioner should be asked to do what he/she cannot do.
- ♦ No parishioner should be asked to do what is unreasonable.
- ♦ The people have a right to Mass and the Sacraments.
- ♦ The people have a right to pastoral care.
- ♦ These should normally be provided by a priest who is part of the community.
- ♦ No parish has an automatic right to exist in its present form.
- Every parishioner is called to holiness.
- ♦ The people have a duty to play their full part in parish life.
- ♦ The people must be flexible and willing to adapt to changing circumstances.
- ♦ The people have a right to education in faith.
- ♦ The people have a right to properly celebrated liturgy.
- ♦ The people have a right to be ministered to by holy and prayerful priests.
- ♦ The people have a right to be led by priests whose theology is up-to-date.
- ♦ The people have no right to unrealistic expectations of priests.
- ♦ The people have a right to be consulted on matters concerning parish life.

Concerning Sunday Mass

- * The Sunday Mass is at the centre of parish life.
- * The quality of liturgy is more important than the number of Masses available.
- * Mass is a celebration of faith and not a duty to be performed.
